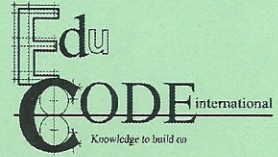

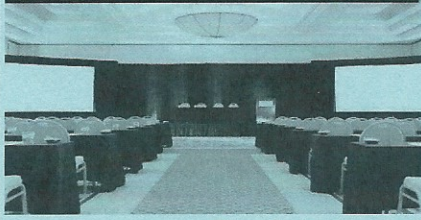

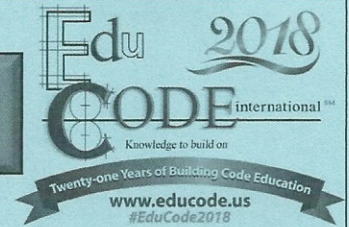

It is very important that you sign twice, otherwise your record may not reflect your attendance, receiving materials, certificate and could jeopardize class credit.



EduCode Class Room & Trade Show Map

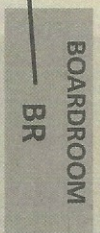
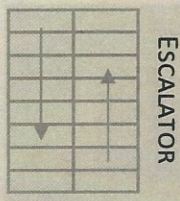

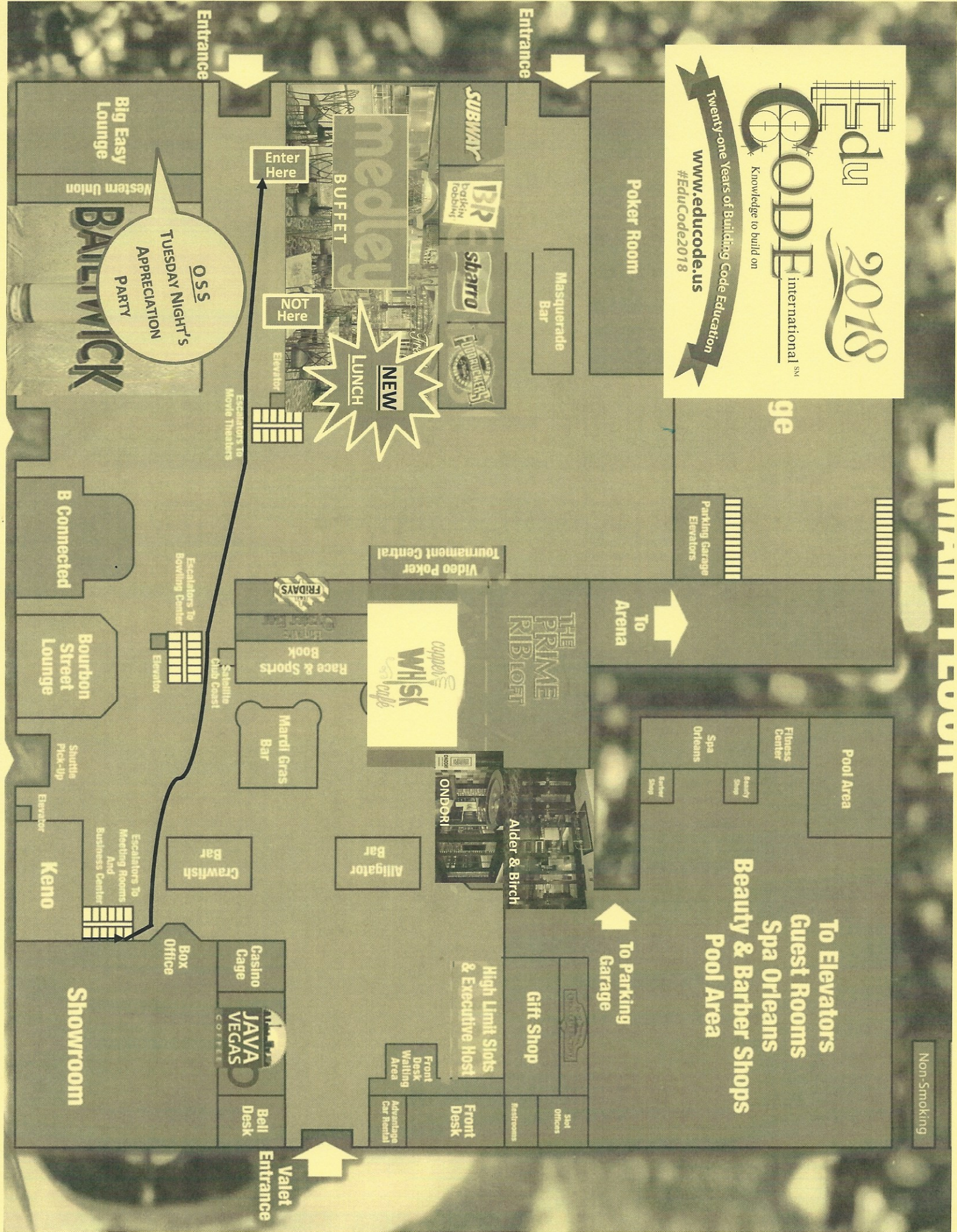

The PPP class # has been added to your certificate of completion (cert). This will help you in tracking your CEUs.

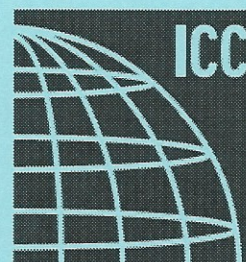

Las Vegas Construction Report



Opened 2017

Wynn Plaza – \$54 million, two-story 75,000 sq. ft. retail, restaurants. In front of Wynn Hotel. Plus, the **T-Mobile Parking Structure** - \$54 million 3,000-space parking structure behind Excalibur serves the T-Mobile Area.

2018

- **Park MGM.** What used to be the Monte Carlo Hotel, is now finishing a \$450 million transformation. Work includes adding **NoMad Las Vegas** (hotel), a hotel-within-a hotel.
- **Palms Casino Resort.** Off strip hotel is undergoing a \$620 million renovation with room redesigns, new restaurants, nightclub, year-round pool club and revamped Pearl Theater.
- **San Antonio Stars/Las Vegas Aces.** Relocation of WNBA Stars to Las Vegas. Renamed LV Aces. MGM new owners. Will start play 2018 season at Mandalay Bay Events Center.
- **Bally's "Twilight Zone,"** glow-in-the-dark miniature golf course, mini-bowling, arcade. Located in a 10,000 sq. ft "shop" in the downstairs shopping concourse. Lots of black light and dayglow. In the works is a science fiction-themed wedding chapel.

2018 and beyond *(over \$10 billion dollars of new construction planned)*

- **Las Vegas (Raiders) Stadium** - \$1.9 billion, 65,000 seat domed stadium. Work underway. Remote parking may include The Orleans!! To open in 2020 season.
- **Wynn Paradise Park.** Work has begun on the 47 story, 1,500 room hotel-casino with the hourglass-shaped lagoon, carousel, zipline, bumper-car course and night parades along its mile-long boardwalk. Using part of Wynn golf course behind Wynn/Encore for new hotel.
- **MSG Sphere.** Joint venture between Sands Corp and Madison Square Garden to open 360-foot-high, geodesic dome, 18,500 seat arena behind Sands Expo. Described as the "world's largest venue built specifically for concerts and live entertainment." The Sphere's exterior has 190,000 feet (35 miles) of LED lighting. Inside the dome, is something like a 360-degree IMAX experience, with about 180,000-square-feet (four acres) of high resolution video across the dome's roof. Construction starts in June 2018. Opens 2020.
- **Monorail Expansion.** New leg from MGM to Mandalay Bay approved. Opens 2020.
- **All Net Arena** \$2.7 billion project located next to SLS (Sahara) plans 1,500 rooms, a multi-use 22,000-seat arena with a retractable roof (architect used a barrel cactus for the arena design); restaurants; night clubs, retail, a 16-screen movie theater. The stalled project has received new money from Credit Suisse.

Other: 18 Fremont (former Las Vegas Club, downtown Las Vegas). Planned April announcement of scope and design of proposed largest hotel in downtown Las Vegas.

Resort World Las Vegas. Much delayed resort. Former site of Stardust Hotel. Released \$400 million of \$7.2 billion (total cost source Wikipedia) construction contracts. **Las Vegas Convention Center** \$1.4 billion (of \$2.3 billion) expansion into area occupied by Riviera Hotel. First phase (of four) will expand LVVC by 1.8 million sq. ft. Opens 2020 for CES. **The Drew Las VEGs.** Former Fontainebleau. Nearly 4,000 rooms, 20 restaurants, 500,000 sq. ft convention center. **Caesars Forum Conference Center.** \$375 million, 550,000 sq. ft. one level center. 200 breakout rooms with two of the largest ballrooms in the world. Located behind the "High Roller" ferris wheel. Connects to Linq & Flamingo hotels and monorail station. **Wynn West.** Plans 2,000 to 3,000 rooms. Of note Wynn West will be connected to Wynn and Encore hotels by means of an "umbilical hallway," across the "Strip."





Tipping In Las Vegas



Please do not tip hotel employees with casino chips, tokens or the paper cash slips. Most casinos have policies about how the employee can or cannot "cash-out" these types of tips. If you still wish to tip this way, it would be wise to ask the employee if they can take chips, tokens or the cash slips at this property.

Q: How about some tipping guidelines for Las Vegas hotel workers -- valet, bellman, cocktail waitresses, housekeepers, food servers?

A: Buffet servers normally get \$1 per person at the table. Food servers in sit-down restaurants expect the normal 15% - 20% of the bill, minus sales tax and expensive bottles of wine. For highly attentive service, 20% is a good tip. If you've got a 2-for-1 coupon, be sure to tip on the pre-discount total.

** (EduCode has paid the "tip" at the "Medley Buffet", but feel free to leave a tip for good service.)*

Ideas

Valet parking attendants have typically received a buck per delivery since the 1960s. Notice the word "delivery": most people don't tip valets when they park their cars, only when they bring them back. If you "toke" a valet driver a buck when he takes your car or \$2- \$5 when he drops it off, you'll be George (a big tipper.)

Bellmen generally get a dollar or two a bag. If a luggage handler is especially helpful, or goes above and beyond the call of duty, you might consider a five-dollar bill, even if you have only one or two bags. If you're not going directly to your room and want your luggage waiting for you when you get there, tip the bellman when he takes your bags; otherwise you might have to call for your luggage when you get to your room.

A good tip for a **cocktail waitress** is a dollar every time she brings you a drink. If you're a heavy drinker, however, and want attentive service throughout your gambling session, you might consider a couple of bucks per drink.

Many hotel guests don't consider **housekeeping** a tip position, so anything you leave a hotel maid is great. A good rule of thumb is to tip \$3.00 - \$5.00 a night. If you're particularly messy or have kids in the room, you may wish to leave a little more.



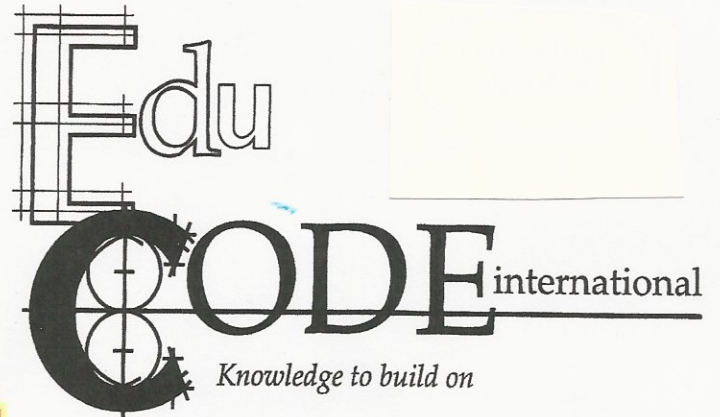

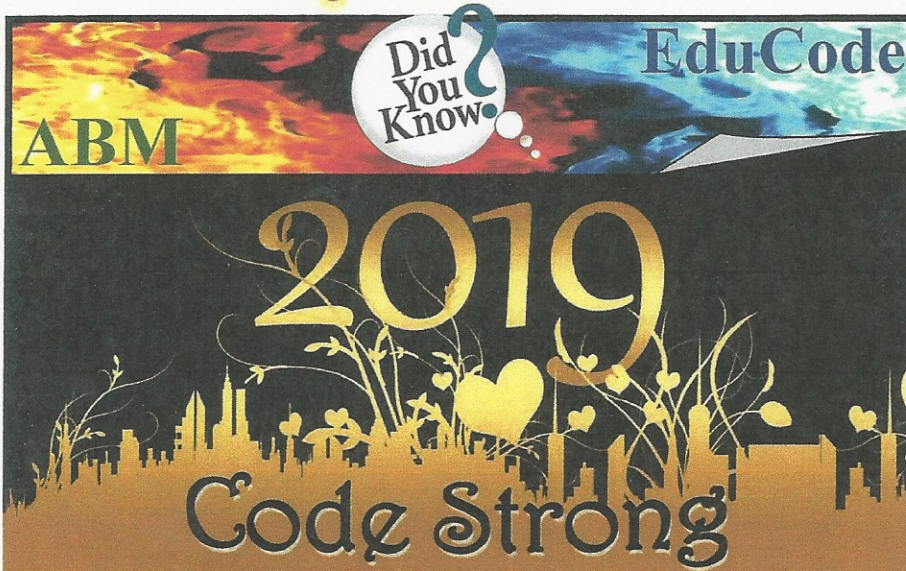
